
Our Mission

Excellence – We strive to exceed the expectations and aspirations of our students and ourselves, are committed to the highest standards, and students are empowered to their highest potential.













Total Donations – 5-year Giving History





Total Giving by Category – \$1,936,660






Funding to CSN – 5-year Giving History

Spirit of CSN Grant Awards

Each year, the Spirit of CSN Grant Awards funds projects that put students first. Funded through the CSN Foundation with support from employees and community partners, these grants empower faculty and staff to launch innovative initiatives that directly align with CSN's mission to empower students and the community to achieve, succeed, and prosper.

Proposals for this grant must focus on student-centered outcomes that support CSN's student success metrics: completion, graduation, and transfer. This year's awardees reflect the wide range of challenges students face and the powerful impact of focused, compassionate solutions.

FY 2023-24 Spirit of CSN Grant Award Recipients

Cody's Locker

Cody's Locker provides students with basic classroom necessities such as notebooks, paper, pencils, pens, and backpacks. With multiple locker locations across CSN campuses, the initiative ensures that students have the basic tools they need to focus on learning, not expenses. More than 4,000 students used Cody's Lockers in 2023-2024. This program continues to eliminate a barrier to success and affirm, that no student should have to choose between class participation and affordability.

Period Equity

Menstrual products are a basic necessity, not a luxury. The Period Equity project combats period poverty by offering free menstrual hygiene products in CSN Student Unions and through discreet distribution systems across all three main campuses. The grant award was used to purchase a mix of organic and conventional products, including pads, tampons, and panty liners, which were distributed in partnership with the Coyote Cupboard. Tear-off flyers allowed students to request supplies discreetly.

Sankofa English 101 and 102 Initiative

Developed by the Division of Student Affairs and the English Department, the Sankofa Initiative supports African American students through culturally relevant English courses that center Black authors and perspectives. With support from the Spirit of CSN Award, the initiative provides free books and supplies, helping students to fully engage in coursework. Survey feedback shows that the program boosts retention, deepens student-instructor connections, and makes students feel seen and supported at CSN.





FY 2023-24 Spirit of CSN Grant Award Recipients

The Great Textbook Voucher Program

The TRIO Student Support Services initiative distributes bookstore vouchers to first-generation and low-income students, reducing the financial stress of textbook purchases. This helps students cover critical course materials, keeping them enrolled and engaged. One recipient shared, "Thank you so much for the bookstore voucher! It means a lot to me. This voucher will allow me to purchase textbooks and concentrate on my education without stressing about the cost."

Walking on Eggshells But Getting Prepared for It

The phrase "walking on eggshells" has been used to describe the anxiety nursing students feel before their first face-to-face interaction with a psychiatric patient. This project used updated Hearing Voices Simulation equipment and intensive role-play practice to reduce student anxiety and boost empathy. Students reported increased confidence, empathy, and reduced anxiety, with one participant stating, "It helped develop empathy for struggles the psych patient faces." This initiative not only transformed classroom experience but also better prepares students to deliver compassionate psychiatric care.

Outstanding Student Awards

The College of Southern Nevada's Outstanding Student Award recognizes exceptional student achievement in specific program areas. The CSN Foundation is proud to enhance this award by providing additional financial support to help students continue their education at CSN or another NSHE institution. We proudly salute this year's 22 scholarship recipients for their outstanding accomplishments and dedication to academic excellence.





Student Emergency Fund

At the College of Southern Nevada, many of our students are balancing full-time jobs, caring for families, and navigating life's unpredictability while pursuing their education. A single unexpected expense can easily derail their progress. The CSN Student Emergency Fund (SEF) exists to keep our students in school.

Established in 2018, the SEF was designed to provide immediate, short-term financial support to CSN students facing unforeseen emergencies – everything from rent and utility bills to medical costs and car repairs. Thanks to the generosity of our community, the Fund has made a meaningful difference in the lives of more than 2,300 students since its inception.

In FY 2023-24, the CSN Foundation raised \$142,154.81, and **244 student applications were awarded, totaling \$110,590.58**. These funds provided relief at the right moment to help students stay enrolled and on track for graduation.

The stories behind the numbers are powerful. Students have shared how SEF helped them stay enrolled and focused on studying instead of picking up extra shifts to cover emergency expenses.

"Receiving funds from the CSN Student Emergency Fund allowed me to continue my schooling. Had I not been able to continue during that time, I feel I would have possibly stopped altogether before even getting my AA degree."

The need is ongoing and growing. For many students, education is the key to transforming their future. However, they remain just one crisis away from falling behind or dropping out. The CSN Foundation ensures that more students facing hardship don't have to choose between paying a bill and completing their education.

Coyote Cupboard

Keeping Students Nourished, Focused, and Thriving

Food insecurity is more than a statistic – it is a daily reality for many students balancing school, work, and family responsibilities. Nearly half of CSN's student body receives Pell Grants, and many face financial strain that places them just above the poverty line. Since its launch in Fall 2018, the Coyote Cupboard has provided a vital safety net, providing emergency groceries to students across all three CSN campuses.

"It means the security to eat three meals a day. It's my avenue to health and profoundly helps my mental health."

More than 40,000 visits have been made to the cupboards, with over 10,800 in the last year alone. One student shared, "It's the difference between starving and thriving."

Operated as an emergency food pantry – not a snack shack or lunch line – the Coyote Cupboard is designed to offer essential grocery items, including fresh produce, shelf-stable ingredients, school supplies, and hygiene kits. It ensures students don't have to choose between their education and their next meal.

Eligible participants include current CSN students, with a valid CSN ID. Each student may receive one bag of groceries every two weeks, while supplies last. Additional resources include Baby's Bounty (diapers) and Coyote's Closet (professional attire) at the North Las Vegas and Charleston campuses.

The CSN Foundation is proud to help support the Coyote Cupboard, ensuring students stay nourished, focused, and on track to graduate – because no one should have to learn on an empty stomach.

When Linda Foreman arrived in Las Vegas with a suitcase, a camera, and a hundred dollar bill, she had no idea the city and the College of Southern Nevada would become her lifelong home. Born into a working-class family in Seattle, Linda was on track to attend a community college back home. But a two-week vacation turned into a permanent move, and she enrolled at what was then Clark County Community College.

It was 1974. The campus was a handful of teachers in a rundown Main Street building. Linda studied in a nearby café, often in the company of her professors. "They taught me that I had a brain and maybe I ought to stick around," she recalls.

After a hiatus to serve in the U.S. Army, Linda returned in 1979 with a GI Bill and a renewed sense of purpose. That marked the beginning of a 50-year relationship with CSN, first as a student, then as a part-time instructor, and eventually as a full-time faculty member teaching sociology.

During some 32 years with Maryknoll, Howle spent 19 years in the Philippines, and four years in Borneo and Indonesia. Besides pastoral work, he was manager of a commercial radio station, did substance abuse counseling, and gave leadership training. He came to Las Vegas in 1981, and was program manager of the substance abuse unit of Montevista before onening.

Before coming to Las Vegas, Mary held several responsible positions in both county and state offices in Illinois, and later with the Lilly Endowment Fund in Indianapolis. Her years in Chicago during the turbulent '60's were memo-

workers, nurses, educators, and helpers of all kinds. 'Sociology is the most needed discipline of our time," she says. "And CSN is where the mermaid stands: the place where people find their path, their voice, and their purpose."

Assistance League of Las Vegas (ALLV), now officially known as "Assisting Lives in Las Vegas", is a dedicated, all-volunteer nonprofit organization committed to improving the lives of children and adults in need throughout our community.

Founded in 1976, Assisting Lives in Las Vegas is preparing to celebrate its 50-year jubilee. Membership is open to women, men, and teens, with more than 360 active members currently contributing their time, talents, and compassion. In a recent year, ALLV volunteers collectively contributed over 50,000 hours through local philanthropic programs and fundraising events.

Partnership with the CSN Foundation

Assisting Lives in Las Vegas has supported the CSN Foundation for over two decades, beginning with generous, in-kind donations. In 2020, ALLV expanded its impact by launching a substantial annual scholarship program aimed at supporting CSN students pursuing workforce-ready certificate programs.

These scholarships provide essential funding for students enrolled in high-demand fields such as Practical Nursing, Dental Assisting, Pastry Arts, Medical Coding, Hotel Management, and Medical Assisting. These programs equip students with the skills needed for immediate employment in Southern Nevada's workforce.

A Broader Mission of Service

ALLV also serves the broader community through a variety of vital programs. Its long-standing Thrift Shop, located at W. Charleston Boulevard and Torrey Pines Drive, has been a community fixture since the 1990s. Proceeds from the shop support ALLV's philanthropic initiatives, and unsold merchandise is donated to other nonprofits, continuing the cycle of giving.

Sue Trock, ALLV 2024-2025 President-Elect, states it best, "We don't have to see the person to know we are making a difference. It's community supporting the community."

One of the chapter's most impactful programs is Operation School Bell, now known as "Our School Boutique," which provides clothing and essentials to students from pre-K through 8th grade who are in need.

When asked about a memorable moment at ALLV, Rolande Werner, Scholarship Committee Chair, said, "The type of work at ALLV and the number of committed volunteers and valuable hours given, speak volumes – this is how the HUGE difference is made."
