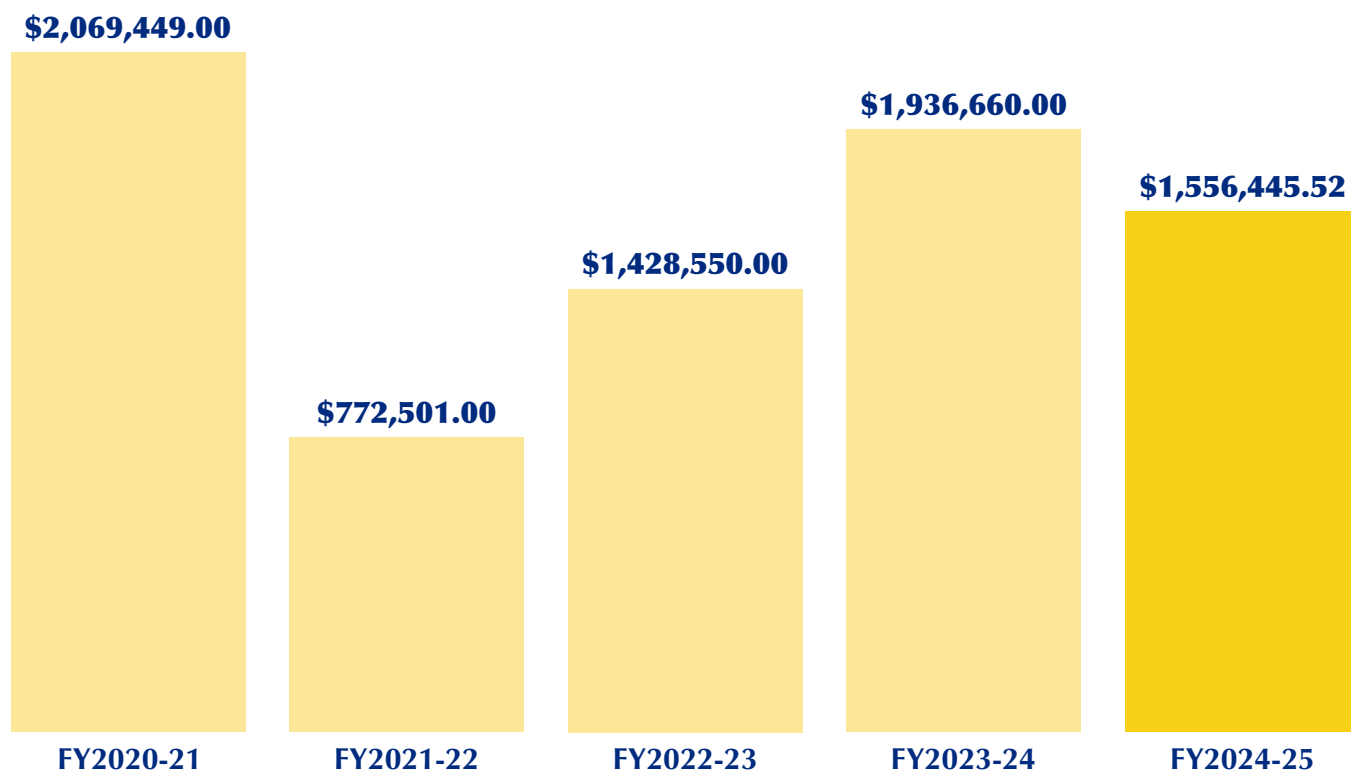

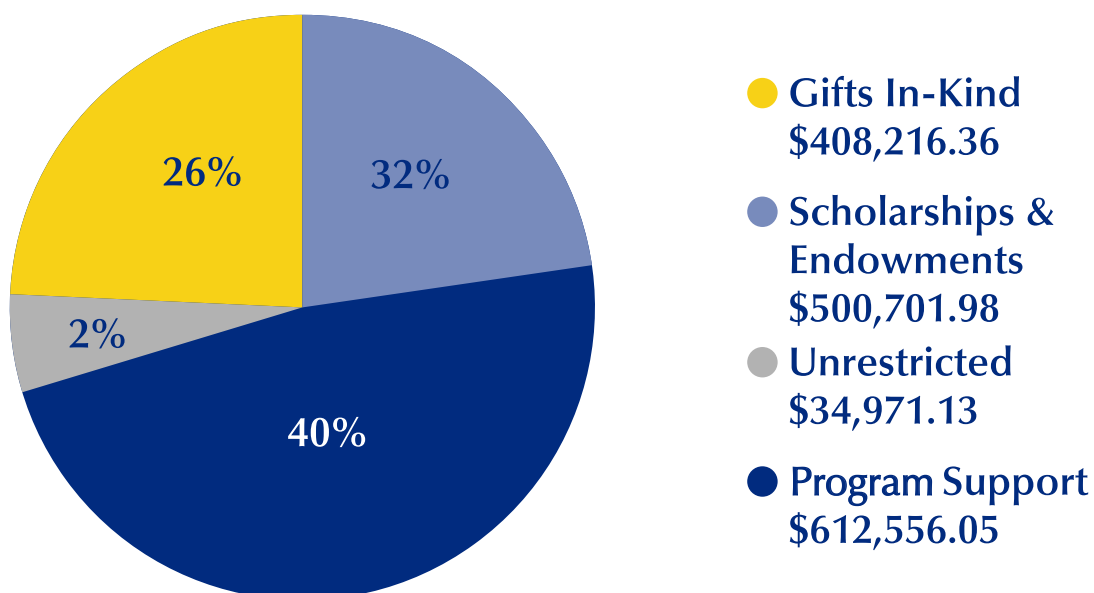

Total Donations – 5-year Giving History

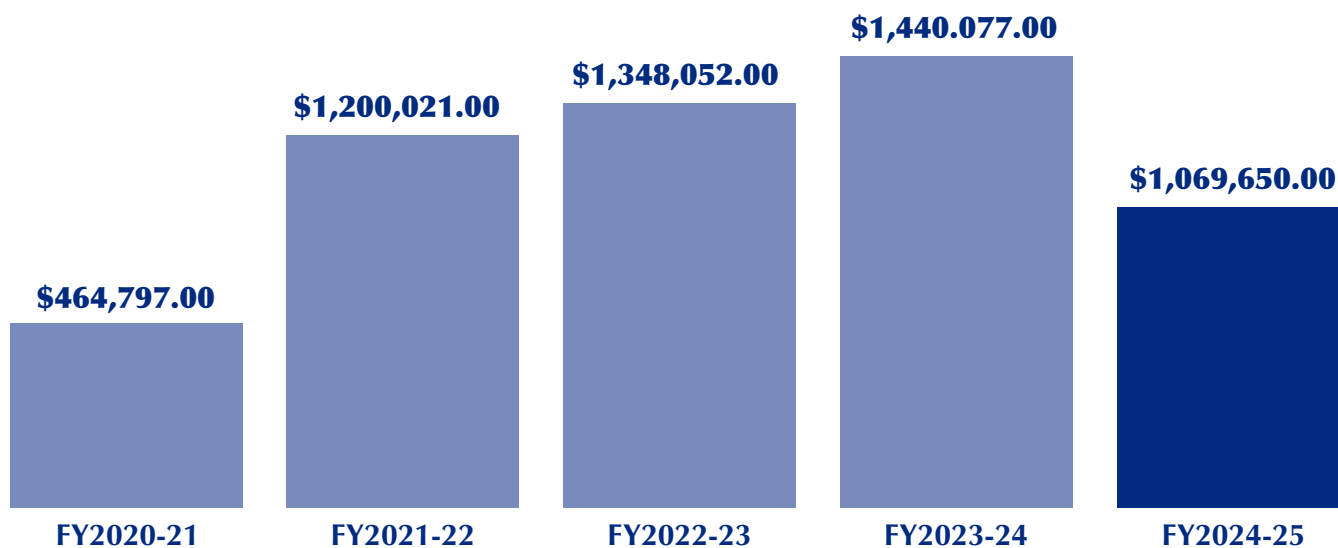


Total Giving by Category **\$1,556,445.52**

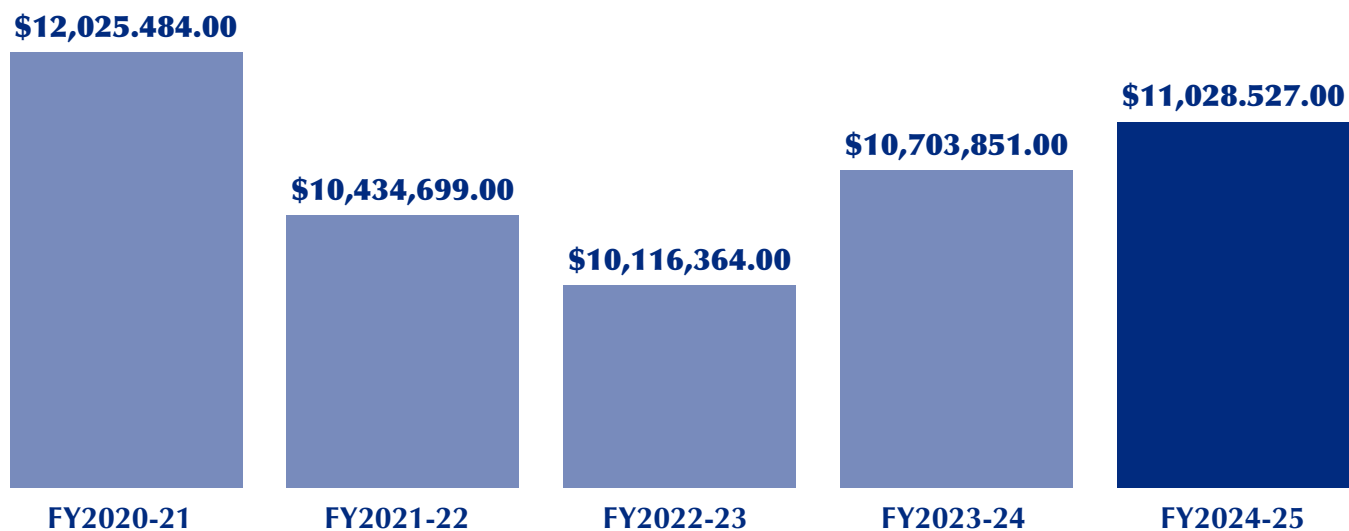

Student Emergency Fund

At the College of Southern Nevada, many of our students are balancing full-time jobs, caring for families, and navigating life's unpredictability while pursuing their education. A single unexpected expense can easily derail their progress. The CSN Student Emergency Fund (SEF) exists to keep our students in school.

Established in 2018, the SEF was designed to provide immediate, short-term financial support to CSN students facing unforeseen emergencies – everything from rent and utility bills to medical costs and car repairs. Thanks to the generosity of our community, the Fund has made a meaningful difference in the lives of more than 2,300 students since its inception.

"An unexpected medical emergency left me with bills I wasn't prepared for. Receiving assistance from the student emergency fund meant I didn't have to choose between my health and my education."

The need is ongoing and growing. For many students, education is the key to transforming their future. However, they remain just one crisis away from falling behind or dropping out. The CSN Foundation ensures that more students facing hardship don't have to choose between paying a bill and completing their education.

Coyote Cupboard

Keeping Students Nourished, Focused, and Thriving

Food insecurity is more than a statistic - it is a daily reality for many students balancing school, work, and family responsibilities. Nearly half of CSN's student body receives Pell Grants, and many face financial strain that places them just above the poverty line. Since its launch in Fall 2018, the Coyote Cupboard has provided a vital safety net, providing emergency groceries to students across all three CSN campuses.

More than 40,000 visits have been made to the cupboards, with over 10,800 in the last year alone.

Operated as an emergency food pantry, the Coyote Cupboard is designed to offer essential grocery items, including fresh produce, shelf-stable ingredients, school supplies, and hygiene kits. It ensures students don't have to choose between their education and their next meal.

Eligible participants include current CSN students with a valid CSN ID. Each student may receive one bag of groceries every two weeks, while supplies last. Additional resources include Baby's Bounty (diapers) and Coyote's Closet (professional attire) at the North Las Vegas and Charleston campuses.

The CSN Foundation is proud to help support the Coyote Cupboard, ensuring students stay nourished, focused, and on track to graduate – because no one should have to learn on an empty stomach.

For James R. York, the College of Southern Nevada provided something far more valuable than a degree, it provided confidence.

Today, James York serves as Founder, President, and CEO of Valley Bank of Nevada, the first and only bank chartered in his hometown of North Las Vegas. With more than 40 years of banking experience, he is recognized as one of Southern Nevada's most respected business and community leaders. Yet, his journey began as a CSN student attending classes at the North Las Vegas campus while balancing work and family responsibilities.

James credits CSN with helping him realize his potential. "I was an average high school student and had not planned to go to college," he recalls. "What I learned was that I was as intelligent as anybody else as long as I applied myself."

That confidence inspired him to continue his education, earning both bachelor's and master's degrees and becoming the first person in his family to graduate from college.

James' commitment to CSN extends far beyond his time as a student. As a longtime member of the CSN Foundation Board of Trustees and former Board Chairman, he has helped shape the Foundation's philanthropic vision and impact. Athletic Highlights

Opening Doors for Student-Athletes

BASEBALL

Baseball is one of CSN's flagship programs, with 14 conference championships, seven Region 18 championships, four NJCAA Western District championships and the 2003 NJCAA National Championship. The Coyotes play home games at William R. Morse Stadium on the Henderson Campus.



SOFTBALL

Lady Coyote Softball competes at Lady Coyote Field on the Henderson Campus. The program has established itself as one of the top teams in the region, highlighted by one conference championship while continuing to build a tradition of success and attract talented student-athletes.



MEN'S SOCCER

Men's Soccer has quickly emerged as a premier program, winning conference and Region 18 championships and earning a berth in the NJCAA Division I Men's Soccer National Championship. The Coyotes attract top talent from Nevada and beyond and compete at the highest level of junior college soccer.
